# Purpose of the SABG



Support primary prevention activities



Provide priority treatment and recovery services

# Funding requirement / set-aside

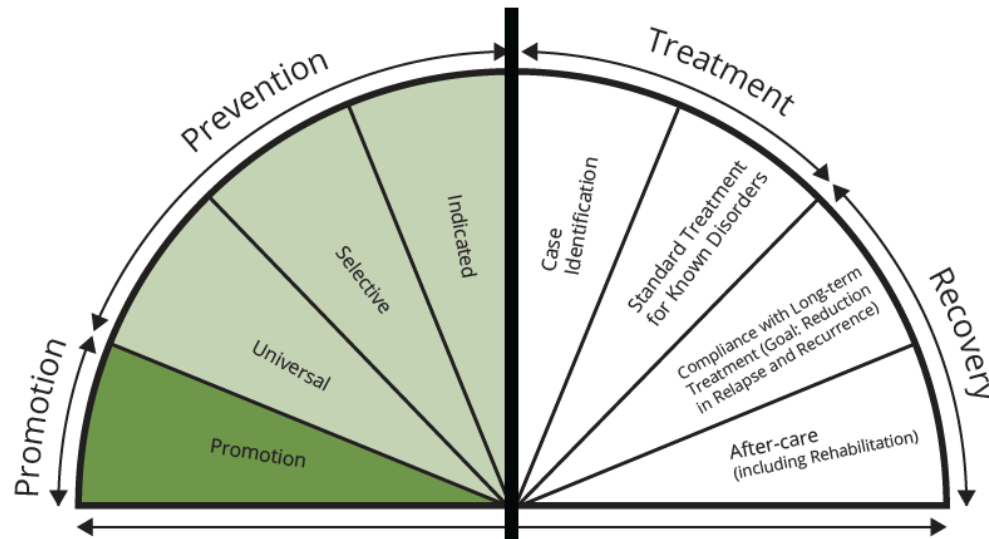
- ▶ 5% cap for administration (salary, travel, evaluation)
- ▶ 20% minimum for primary prevention
- ▶ Pregnant & Parenting Women treatment set aside:  
*Formulated amount from 2004 (approximately \$250,000)*
- ▶ Current proposed bill:
  - ▶ 10% set-aside for recovery services

# Funding Allocation: \$6,533,901

October 1, 2021- September 30, 2022

Primary Prevention = \$1,633,475 (25%)

Treatment & Recovery = \$4,900,426 (75%)

## Priority #1: Prevention & Early Intervention

### Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP) Primary Prevention Strategies

- ▶ Information Dissemination
- ▶ Education
- ▶ Alternatives
- ▶ Problem Identification and Referral
- ▶ Collaboration
- ▶ Environmental Changes

# Priority #1: Prevention & Early Intervention

## Community-Level Prevention Implementation

Tribal Contracts \$80,000/year per Tribe

- ▶ Spirit Lake Tribe
- ▶ Three Affiliated Tribes
- ▶ Turtle Mountain Community College






# Priority #1: Prevention & Early Intervention

## Increasing enforcement of underage drinking laws

### *ND Tip*

- ▶ Contract with Citizen Observer
- ▶ 5-year contract / \$84,000

- ▶ Call Kay

Withdrawal Management

- ▶ **Mobile Outreach Program (MOP)**
  - ▶ \$608,764/biennium
  - ▶ Contract with City of Fargo
- ▶ **Barnes County Training/technical assistance**
  - ▶ \$95,000 one-time amount
  - ▶ Contract with Health Management Associates (HMA)
- ▶ **Human Service Center's contract Clay County Medical Withdrawal**
  - ▶ \$342/person per day (not to exceed \$1,238,799/biennium)
