

2021 Child Care Assistance Market Rate Survey with Narrow Cost Analysis

Economic Assistance Policy
Children and Family Services
June 2021

INTRODUCTION

The North Dakota Department of Human Services (DHS) Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) helps low-income eligible families pay for childcare while parents work or participate in allowable training or education programs. The ND DHS sets maximum rates that can be paid for childcare under CCAP. Federal regulations (45 CFR 98.16(1) and 98.43(b)(2)) require DHS to conduct a biennial market rate survey to ensure that payment rates allow CCAP families "equal access" to childcare services. The federal Administration for Children and Families states that "payments established at least at the 75th percentile of the market would be regarded as providing equal access." This report will provide both the 50th (median) and 75th percentiles of provider charges.

METHODOLOGY

UNIVERSE

A total of 1,256 Center and Licensed/Family Group childcare providers, certified, or registered with the state of North Dakota were invited to participate in the survey (Survey instrument, Appendix B). Child Care Aware (CCA) of North Dakota sent an email inviting and providing the link to the survey (see email in Appendix B). A listing of all current childcare providers is generated monthly by Information Technology Services (ITS) for DHS Children and Family Services (CFS). The following types of providers were included in the mailing:

CENTER

- Childcare center, C
- Preschool education facility, E
- School age childcare, K
- Multiple licenses, M

LICENSED FAMILY/GROUP

- Family childcare, F
- Group childcare home, G
- Group childcare facility, H

SURVEY PROCESS

For this year's report, we worked with Child Care Aware (CCA) on the planning part of the survey. During the fall 2020 and early winter of 2021, we worked with CCA to develop the survey instrument and develop a plan for conducting the survey. The plan consisted of CCA sending out the surveys and collecting the surveys for the Economic Assistance Program (EAP). In some cases (especially if they had not completed the survey), CCA staff contacted the Licensed Child Care Providers to collect the information in Survey Monkey. The referral database was used to identify licensed childcare providers in the state who were eligible to complete the MRS.

The last day of survey collection (complete the survey online) was May 5th, 2021.

Data were gathered for 4 different rate/billing structures and 4 different child age groups.

The rate/billing structures were:

Full Time (25 hours per week or more)

- Full Time Hourly
- Full Time Daily
- Full Time Weekly
- Full Time Monthly

Part Time (Less than 25 hours per week)

- Full Time Hourly
- Full Time Daily
- Full Time Weekly
- Full Time Monthly

The child age groups were:

- Infants (Birth to 17 months)
- Toddlers, (18 months to 35 months)
- Preschool Age (3 years up to 5 years)
- School Age (6 years to 12 years)

DATA MANAGEMENT

The database generated by Survey Monkey was exported in Excel format and from Excel to IBM SPSS Statistics (v26) for data analysis and statistical generation. Additional data quality control checks were incorporated into the programming. The Data Division of the Information Technology Department worked on the analysis for this report.

STATISTICAL ANALYSIS PLAN

For analysis purposes the dataset was limited to facilities that have any private pay childcare slots that are not subsidized by Federal, State, or local subsidies or grant funds. Full-time and part-time hourly/daily/weekly rates were converted into monthly rates. Frequency distributions and percentages are used to show results for categorical variables. Central tendency measures (arithmetic mean, median, minimum, and maximum) and measures of position (percentiles) were conducted for quantitative data. The 50th, 55th, 60th, 65th, 70th, 75th, 80th, 85th, 90th, 95th and 100th percentiles were computed for two categorical provider type classifications: Center (C, E, K, M) and Licensed Family/Group (F, G, H). The rates/billings do not include any discount in the rate. For the percentiles calculation the weighted average method was used (IBM SPSS Statistics v 26). In this method the kth percentile (e.g. 50th) is the weighted average of the percentiles calculated.

RESULTS

Response Rate, Quality Rating and Improvement System and ND Child Care Assistance Program (n=1,055)

• Of the 1,256 surveys sent, 1,055 surveys were completed for an overall response rate of 84.0%. The table below shows the response rates by provider type. The regions are comprised of certain counties (see table in Appendix B).

■ 88% (922/1,048) of providers are willing to put families on a waiting list.

TRANSPORTATION:

- A similar distribution was observed between programs that are on a school transportation route and programs that are not on a school route (Yes: 49%, 500/1,023 and No: 51%, 523/1,023).
- Very few programs are located near public transportation (31% 316/1,008).

LANGUAGES:

■ Most programs use the English language (99%). Only 1.9% (20) use Spanish and 2.7% (28) use American Sign Language.



LIMITATIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

- Child Care providers may or may not have included other fees (e.g. Meals, snacks, and formula) in their rates.
- Although surveys provide valuable information, the reliability of the survey is determined by several factors, including the responses provided by the providers (accurate, precise, honest answers).



Objective

To assess variations in childcare rates/billings and provider type by region in the State of North Dakota.

Analysis Plan

One-way analysis of variance (ANOVA)* was used to determine if there were statistically significant differences in the below factors by region:

- Licensed Capacity
- Desire Capacity
- Full-Time Rate/Billing Structure (\$):
 - o Age of child: Infant, Toddler, Pre-school, School Age Hourly/Daily/Weekly/Monthly
- Part-Time Rate/Billing Structure (\$):
 - o Age of child: Infant, Toddler, Pre-school, School Age Hourly/Daily/Weekly/Monthly
- Total enrollment
- Enrollment by age of child:
 - o Infants, Toddlers, Pre-school, School Age
- Total Full-time vacancies
- Full-time vacancies by age of child:
 - o Infants, Toddlers, Pre-school, School Age
- Part-Time vacancies by age of child;
 - o Infants, Toddlers, Pre-school, School Age

*It is assumed that the data show a normal distribution, that the groups, in this case region, are independent and that the variances are homogeneous.


The Pearson chi-square test was used to assess whether there were differences in the number of providers (Center vs. Licensed Family/Group) by region.

For all tests, the differences were evaluated at a significance level of 0.05. This means that if the p value is less than 0.05, then we say that differences are observed in X factor (e.g. provider type) by region.

Summary of findings


- The highest number of responses was obtained from Region V
- <u>Significant differences</u> by region were observed in the following factors:
 - o Number of providers (Center vs. Licensed Family/Group)

Regardless of the type of provider, the region with the highest number of providers is Region V and the region with the lowest number of providers is Region I.



Licensed capacity




Desired Capacity



The highest average in licensed capacity and desired capacity is shown by Region V (higher than the overall/total average).



 - Infant daily






Infant monthly



Region I showed the highest average $(1,033.3\pm152.8)$, with Region II showing the lowest average (605.4 ± 275.0) .




Toddler monthly




Infant weekly


o Enrollment by age of child: Infant, Toddler, pre-school and School age








o Part-Time Vacancies School Age Children (6 to 12 years old)


School age monthly




Infant monthly






Toddler monthly






Pre-school monthly








School age monthly








o Full-time vacancies school age





Part-time vacancies Toddlers




