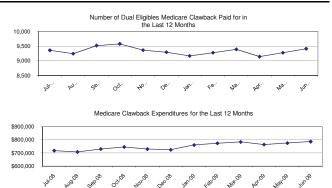




Section 9 - MEDICARE CLAWBACK APPROPRIATION 2007 - 2009 BIENNIUM \$19,149,615

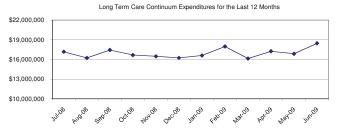

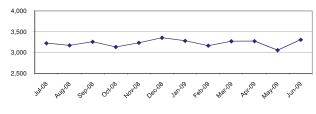

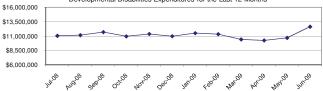
