



Foster Care Expenditures for Last 12 Months







The Money Follows the Person program started in 2008 and assists people who want to move from institutional settings back to the community. The program is also designed to increase community-based long term care services and supports

In the last three calendar years 98.7% of the transitions were to a home living arrangement while 1.3% were to an assisted living facility.

The appropriation contains funding for contractual services, which includes transition coordination services, outreach services, recipient transitional costs, and other housing and support services.








PROGRAM NOTES:

The Medicaid Autism Waiver, approved by The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), provides services for individuals from birth through age nine. As of September 30, 2015 there were 43 participants on the Autism Waiver.

The Autism Voucher program, assists in funding equipment and general educational needs for individuals, below two hundred percent of the federal poverty level, from age three up to age eighteen and who have been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder. These services are funded from the state general fund. As of September 30, 2015, there were 27 participants in the Autism Voucher program.

Fluctuations in expenses due to the timing of when payments are made. A large Autism waiver provider had experienced delays in submitting claims for reimbursement and the delay had resulted in a low level of actual expenditures. The department has since worked with the provider to resolve the billing issues.


