Updates:

- Krissie Guerard: Health Equity Office Tribal and NFI Liaisons
 - o Sargam Ghimire is our new NFI Health Liaison; Sonya Abe, Jamie Thongphet, Hunter Parisien and Cheyenne Smith are our new Tribal Health Liaisons.
- Sarah Weninger: Planning Group Update
 - o Town Hall was held in June and announced the new planning group structure 40-50 people attended the Town Hall. Applications were due last month and now have invitations out to around 30 individuals. The first meeting will be held at the end of September.
- Jorden Laducer: Co-Chair Update and 2021 Midwest LGBTQ Health Symposium
 - o James accepted a new position as an editor for a newspaper; therefore, he will be stepping down as a co-chair. Jorden will co-chair with Faye.
 - o Jorden submitted an abstract for the 2021 Midwest LGBTQ Health Symposium and it was selected. Jorden will present the board as one of the first for the L+ communities.



Special Guest Speakers:

- Alicia Belay BeYOU Subcommittee Update
 - o Non-medical vital statistics (data collection). Looking for funding to improve data collection in L+ areas across the state.
 - o Partnering with medical systems to improve non-medical records. Alicia spoke with Sanford and found out that updating medical records (race, etc.) is now required; therefore, records are being updated. A large problem is how to ask patients or patients aren't willing to give their race out.
 - BeYOU board could help fund a community assessment and doing the appropriate intervention based on the data that is gathered. Another option for improving medical records and data gathering would be to add a robust component to the HE initiative through the North and South Dakota Perinatal Quality Collaborative (PQC). We could also partner with Sanford, to create a training.
